

Rabbinic Authority – Avot 1:1

מֹשֶׁה קבֵּל תּוֹרָה מִסִּינַי, וּמְסָרָה לִיהוֹשֻׁעַ, וִיהוֹשֻׁעַ לִזְקֵנִים, וּזְקֵנִים לְנְבִיאִים, וּנְבִיאִים מְסָרוּהָ לְאַנְשֵׁי כְנָסֶת הַגְּדוֹלָה. הֵם אָמְרוּ שְׁלְשָׁה דְבָרִים, הָוּוּ מְתוּנִים בַּדִּין, וְהַעְּמִידוּ תַלְמִידִים הַרְבֵּה, וַעֲשׁוּ סִיָג לַתּוֹרָה:

Moses received the Torah at Sinai and transmitted it to Joshua, Joshua to the elders, and the elders to the prophets, and the prophets to the Men of the Great Assembly. They said three things: Be patient in [the administration of] justice, raise many disciples and make a fence round the Torah.

Some Textual Questions to ask Chanichim:

Do you know who the "men of the great assembly" were?

Why does it say given to Yehosua, but it then leaves the word out?

Some General Questions to ask Chanichim:

Do we priorities Rabinnic law over law that is directly from the Torah law?

Some Personal Questions to ask Chanichim:

Do you think Rabbinic Law is important in Judasim?

Do you find it easier or harder to connect to Rabbinic Law?

Is it easier to focus on the "how?" or the "why?" of halacha?
