THE POWER OF **JEALOUSY** DANIELLA WIEDER

It is a well-known psychological fact that we always find faults in others that are most prominent in ourselves. The Kotzker Rebbe commented that people who guarrel with the righteous try to find complaints in ways that are the exact opposite of the truth. Moshe was the humblest of men, and Aharon's relationship with others was always to pursue peace, which takes much humility. Now we are introduced to their cousin, Korach. Despite everything he had going for him, Korach was upset that he was not one of the leaders of Klal Yisrael. He therefore made accusations against Moshe and Aharon that they were arrogant leaders who were in it for the power and didn't listen to the people. He was jealous of their positions, and given the catastrophe of last week's parasha - where every male over 20 was sentenced to death in the wilderness - this was the perfect opportunity for Korach to start a rebellion against Moshe and Aharon, According to Rabbi Ari Kahn, Bnei Yisrael did not believe that Moshe and Aharon had done enough to save them from this decree by praying to Hashem; just as Moshe fought for them after the Golden Calf.

Moreover, Korach didn't understand how Aharon had not been punished for the instrumental part he played in creating the Golden Calf. In fact, Aharon was promoted to be the Kohen Gadol (High Priest), whereas Korach was 'downgraded' from the position of Kohen to the status of 'generic' Levite. To add fuel to the fire, the Levites had not sent a representative to scout out the land in last week's parasha. The only member of their tribe who was somewhat involved in this sin

was Moshe, as the man who had sent the spies on their mission in the first place. This made Korach's blood boil! But what he perceived as the injustice of it all was the fact that he himself had been denied the position of service in the Temple that would now be taken by Aharon and his sons, while Moshe and Aharon seemed to have slipped away unscathed. This may well be the background to Korach's rebellion; he was driven to distraction by what was, in his opinion, the unfairness of it all.

On this, Rabbi Zelig Pliskin writes that jealousy can be a powerful, self-destructive force. It prevents a person from enjoying what they have. Pirkei Avot 4:21 states: "Jealousy, lust and honour put a man out of the world". Korach's downfall was because of this trait. Not only did he not get what he wanted, but he lost everything he already had. How do we overcome jealousy? The key is to focus on what you yourself have and what you yourself can accomplish in this world. Jealousy arises when we look at others and compare ourselves to them. The ultimate pleasure that we can have in this world is true happiness. When we master this trait by focusing on things that are conducive to real happiness (e.g. by following the Torah), then we will never need to envy anyone.

I feel that this message is more important than ever. We are surrounded by a bombardment of social media, reality TV shows, advertisements, etc. It is enough to make someone who doesn't struggle with jealousy feel envious towards others, and it becomes natural to compare. Let's learn from Korach's mistake. Let's only compare ourselves to ourselves. And let's remind ourselves to focus on how valuable we are and think about all the amazing talents and abilities that Hashem gave specifically to YOU.

KORACH 5780: TAKING IT IN

When I studied Parashat Korach with my 4-yearold son, he couldn't stand the frustration and pain and just burst into tears. He cried for Am Yisrael, who complained all the time and were punished by God repeatedly.

The innocence of a cute young boy who re-learns the Torah stories.

And what can we say? He's right. What is the matter with Am Yisrael? The sin of the spies, the refusal to enter the Promised Land, the sin of the Ma'apilim, complaints about food and water, 'good memories' of the past in Egypt (is that so?).

And now, Korach and his followers come out against the leadership of Moshe and Aharon that was chosen by Hashem.

After all the miracles and wonders Hashem did for the generation who left Egypt with Moshe and Aharon, after all the people heard and saw on Har Sinai how. Moshe spoke, God

answered him in thunder" (Shemot 19:19), after Hashem Himself testified to the greatness of Moshe, "he is trusted throughout My household, With him I speak mouth to mouth...My servant Moshe!" (Bamidbar 12:7). How could Korach and his disciples, important and wise people, say these things?

I remember once asking this question to my father and he answered me with a short quote of the Kotzker Rebbe, about the spiritual and mental state of the Jewish people in the desert.

After crossing the Red Sea, an extraordinarily spiritual event, Chazal describe the size of the column of people: "A maidservant beheld at the Red Sea what was not beheld by Yechezkel" (Mechilta on Shemot). Even a maidservant, in her low rank, while crossing the Red Sea saw even more than what the prophet Yechezkel saw in his prophecy of the Merkava, the holy chariot of God! This is a very high level of spiritual attainment.

If so, how can one explain the fact that Am Yisrael complained immediately afterwards? In his wisdom, the Kotzker Rebbe says: "A maidservant beheld at the Red Sea what was not beheld by Yechezkel and remained a servant". That is to say, despite her spiritual attainment, she did not take advantage of the situation for spiritual strengthening and proximity to God but remained in her rank. Which is also the reason for the repeated complaints of the people: Am Yisrael were not undergoing a gradual and deep process of choosing God and His teachings through self-work, growth and internalisation.

In the absence of a complete internalisation of Torah values, which are not only technical acts but a way of life and a worldview. Am Yisrael are in a troubled and confused situation. The spies have created a crisis of confidence against the leadership of Moshe. The people

have just received harsh Fretz Yisrael

punishments and they need to find their stability to rise from this place so that they can return to the right path and arrive in

The month of Tamuz that

was renewed upon us this

week is the month in which

the days of mourning for

the destruction of the Bet Hamikdash begin (the 'Three Weeks'). The words of the prophet Yishayahu may indicate the fact that the root of destruction lies also in the

absence of a true internalisation of the Torah: "Because that people has approached [Me] with its

mouth and honoured Me with its lips, but has kept its heart far from Me, and its worship of Me has been a commandment of men, learned by rote. Truly, I shall further baffle that people...And the wisdom of its wise shall fail, And the prudence of its prudent shall vanish." (Yishayahu 29:13-14)

It may be said that Korach, about whom the Midrash says, "who certainly was a wise man", also loses his wisdom and disagrees with Moshe and Aharon. The lack of internalisation permeates everyone, from the maidservant at the sea, through the spies, to Korach. Perhaps our great blessing in understanding this parasha, will be the strengthening of one more 'screw' in our connection to the Torah and its understanding and in connection with Am Yisrael.
