- -use a madrich not a Chanich

Why do we live in a Succah?

Because Hashem said so, it is written in the torah. To get this point across think about games that seem to involve blindly following somebodies instructions, simply because they said so.

For example do a blindfolded obstacle course, the chanichim can chooses whether to follow it or not. Ultimately they will see it is to their benefit to follow the instructions given, without this they would be tripping over.

But there is more of a reason than simply because Hashem said so.

It is to remind us that the Bnei Yisrael were in "booths" whilst wondering the desert. They were living a relatively comfortable life in Egypt, no longer slaves yet they followed Hashem blindly into the desert. As well as booths the Bnei Yisrael were also given the Anei Hakavod the "clouds of glory". These clouds gave more protection than a simply booth.

For this part of the Chomer the main discussion point is what a succah represents, the idea that it represents a protection, it may seem counter intuitive to leave our much safer home and go out into these temporary booths.

You can get a great discussion going on this topic, think of a trigger, on how to start the discussion. Perhaps if the right food is available get the chanichim to make Succot out of the food around them, then try and knock them down, showing the fragility of the Succah.

Why do we celebrate Succot in Tishrei?

Tishrei is the month of Teshuva. After the sin of the Golden Calf it was when Hashem fogave us.

The Anei Hakavod which rested above the Bnei Yisrael went away when the Bnei Yisrael committed the sin of the golden calf. Succot is the time when we got the Anei Hakavod back. The Shechinah was once again in the Bnei Yisrael's camp.

Special HALACHOT for the SUKKAH CRAWL

- Remember to make Brachot on all food being eaten.
- Try and make the Brachot in the correct order: Hamotzi, Mezonot, Hagafen, Ha'etz (7 fruits of Israel before others), Ha'adama, Shehakol.
- After making the Bracha on the food, preferably mezonot, make the Bracha of "leishev basukkah." Then try to sit down and eat the food.
- After all the eating is done remember to say a Bracha Acharona, which is al hamichya if at least a Kzayit of mezonot is eaten.
 Remember to add "vesamcheinu beyom chag hasukkot hazeh".
- For all other foods say a "Borei Nefashot".
- Do not touch the decorations on the Sukkah because they are mutkzeh (although taking the mickey out of them is permitted and some say obligatory!).
- There is no obligation to sit and to eat in the Sukkah if it is raining.
